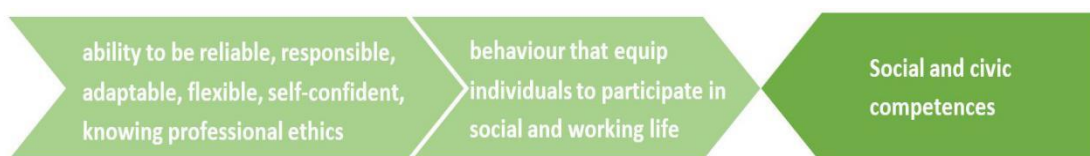
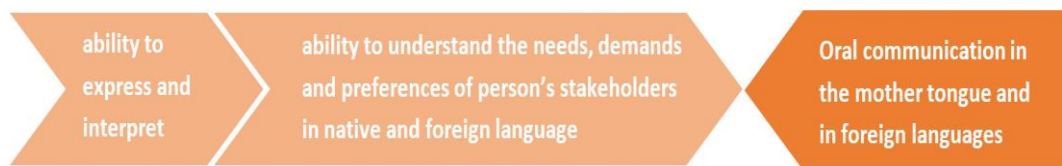


O2-A1 Identification of a set of "career oriented" soft skills

As in any working context a constellation of competencies is required, rather than looking at them in isolation, each student should construct a profile of competencies, most of them to be provided at school and then developed throughout the course of life. Incorporating group work into classroom activities, promoting group discussions, respectful and courteous communication, requiring responsibility and professionalism in completing assignments, encouraging teamwork and collaboration, emphasizing trust, integrity, and collaboration in their activities, providing opportunities for students to visit job sites: these are considered the most effective ways to develop students' soft skills that can be learned and strengthened over time. Anyway, when students regularly see adults who demonstrate these skills, for example by being respectful toward students and colleagues, communicating clearly, and being on time and prepared, they understand their value, and how they apply to real-life situations.
